

## Pastoral Letter March 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I write, I have just read day 14 in the 'catching the wave 40-day prayer guide from the team at TryPraying, and it is all about pressure. The opening statement says 'Stress is good for you, without it we wouldn't get anything done. But too much pressure in our lives can paralyse us". We are all prone to pressure in life and deal with it in different ways, whether in the family, at work, and yes in our church family. Worry abounds with loss and grief, with illness and aging, as well as worries around what is the future of the church.

And it is that particular pressure I want to address in this pastoral letter. What is the future of the church? Well in the broadest sense that is down to God. The church is the bride of Christ and as I've said before He will build His church. When Jesus asked the disciples who he was in Matthew 16, Simon Peter replied "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." and Jesus goes on to say "and I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16.16, 18)

Often this passage is understood to mean that Peter is the rock upon which Jesus would build the church, but is that the case? Isn't the reality that the Lord has built the early church not just upon Peter, but the other disciples too. Upon Paul, upon the Gospels of the disciples Matthew and John, as well as Mark and Luke. Perhaps a better reading is that the rock upon which Jesus will build His church is found in the earlier answer to the question of who Jesus is. "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

The church is built upon the rock that is Jesus Christ. Knowing Jesus as your Saviour and Lord makes you part of the church, a member of the worldwide church as sons and daughters adopted into the Kingdom of God. So where is the pressure and stress about our church today if the Lord is the one on which it is built and He is the one building it.

Well Jesus requires his followers to do their part. The church is not only founded by Christ but is His tool, His weapon if you like, against the sin of the world, against the very gates of hell. As Paul wrote, 'For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. (2Corinthians 10.3-4)

I am feeling the pressure as your minister to not necessarily build the church, but to equip it. As a pastor I try to journey with folk in the difficulties of life and as your minister I do that through pointing to the kingdom of heaven come and yet to come. My heart is for the Bible, for the inspired and breathed scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as I know they are still so relevant to the world today and can relieve the pressures and anxieties created by our world today. But we need the whole people of God (i.e. the congregation) to journey and to support one another, reaching also into the community to share the good news of the Saviour who said "do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?'... But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself." (Matthew 6.31, 33-34)

The church is a place where what we bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever we loose on earth shall also be loosed in heaven (Matthew 18.19). So what are you binding and loosing in your life today? Is your life being lived for the world or for the church of Jesus Christ? As Christians we are called into a particular church family. I say this not because the church is my work, but because the church is Christs. If you belong to Jesus you should belong to the church found in a particular geographical place, i.e. the local church.

My prayer is that our GMC church family will come together throughout Holy Week, journeying to the good news of the cross and empty tomb as a springboard to serve the Lord in His church this coming year.
